Students researching effective public health aid to Africa have an opportunity to look behind headlines and celebrity photo-boos. Public health problems have long been linked to poverty and ignorance. Rich countries have "modern" public health problems like smoking, drinking, and over-medication. But in poor countries, smoking, slaves, no nutrition, lack of medication for serious diseases, and polluted water are central public health problems, as they had been for all civilizations through all history until recent centuries.

Organized, sector-based efforts to provide clean water, clean cooking fuels, and access for infectious diseases are much newer. That history has sometimes turned tragic when elites established health experts opposed insights and innovations from younger researchers.


Ignatius Semmelweis, a young doctor in Vienna, was put in charge of two hospital maternity wards when he made common mistakes, delivering babies in one and "modern" doctors delivering in the other. Leading doctors at the time (1841) wore dirtier coats of midwives and their additional hand-washing before delivering babies. Semmelweis saw 20 percent of babies delivered by doctors die of fever (postpartum sepsis) and much lower death rate with midwives. He established procedures for doctors to wash their hands and mortality rates quickly dropped by two-thirds. Angry doctors considered it a British physician to believe something invisible could cause disease. They had Semmelweis, who was later committed to an insane asylum and died there (of an infection).

So, if tragedies are not unique in the history of medicated public health, the widespread use of quinine to treat malaria was delayed for centuries. Effective treatment of tuberculosis with drugs was vigorously opposed by TB experts of the day who ran sanatoriums. Even today there are fierce disputes over public health issues such as insecticide-treated bed nets vs. indoor L007 spraying to fight malaria in Africa.

Debates over what institutions should do to improve and address public health issues continue to swirl. Today, public health advocates in the U.S. call on government to assist average diets, reduce fatty foods, and sugared sodas.

Striking it home in many cities, public health grounds are in terms, ties in foods. Many foods and overweight people are, of course, major public health problems only in rich countries. Africans are asked to look for being overweight is perhaps the leading indicator of health problems in Americans.

"Public health historian George Rosen claims: 'The protection and promotion of health and welfare of citizens is considered to be one of the most important functions of the modern state.' Rosen writes that how people view public health problems grows from 'the mental
