

Many USFG agencies engage European agencies to advance energy, environmental, tax, competition, public health, labor, industrial, trade, education, and nutrition

policies. Examples include: ESG, tax harmonization (opposing tax competition), "green" energy (intermittent wind/solar energy), electric cars, pandemic policies (model based lockdowns), precautionary

principle for new technologies, public health nutrition and dietary policies. Military/defense/diplomatic engagement are complex. US policies reduce defense spending and alliances across Europe. Students attending Economic Thinking workshops will learn to sort through policy and technology claims

and better understand the dynamics of food, energy (and defense/military) production, distribution, and innovation.
