
USFG agencies engage European agencies to advance agendas across many public policy areas. In addition to diplomatic and defense policies, US and European governments advance policies to change what we eat, how we produce energy, heat homes, and power cars and factories. Other federal agencies work to "harmonize" corporate tax and regulatory policies. Examples include: ESG, renewable energy (wind/solar), pandemic policies (model-based lockdowns), transportation policies, the precautionary principle, plus public health and nutrition policies.

Military/defense/diplomatic engagements and policies are complex. What did America's founders advise? US military spending reduces defense spending by European allies. \*Economic Thinking workshops help students see the often





unintended policies of government policies, and learn to evaluate policy claims. Special interest benefit from government spending and policies, but are often hidden behind public welfare claims.
